This year marks the third time in eight years that a Hopkinsville employee has won the state City Employee of the Year Award. Former Fire Chief Freddie Montgomery received the honor in 2015 followed by Police Chief Clayton Sumner in 2018.

KLC estimates that there are more than 20,000 city employees throughout the Commonwealth. With this award, the organization looks to bring recognition to an exceptional city employee who performs at a distinguished level to improve his or her local government and community.
